Profile:

Gordon Lundy has over thirty years experience as a senior executive in small-to-medium urban municipalities. Most recently, he served the Council of the Specialized Municipality of the Crowsnest Pass, one of only five specialized municipalities in Alberta. These are unique municipal structures that enable urban and rural communities to coexist in a single municipal government.

Prior to his six years in the Crowsnest Pass, Gord was Chief Administrative Officer in the Towns of Barrhead, Peace River and High Level. Among his many accomplishments, he assisted a Town Council to develop a ten-year infrastructure and equipment replacement program using federal and provincial grants that were allocated to priority areas. He also assisted a Council to acquire an airport from Transport Canada and to establish its five-year business plan. Gord assisted a local committee to amalgamate a joint County/Town fire department and he was involved in successful negotiations with the province of Alberta for it to assume all annual policing costs (\$600K) given the municipality's unique circumstances at the time.

Amongst his community activities, he served on the Daishowa Public Advisory Committee on Ecological Management as well as on the boards of the Crowsnest Curling and the Barrhead Rotary Clubs.
